Question: Should progression also be reported as an AE?

**Answer:** No, progression is not an AE. However, when a new cancer is identified, it would require reporting as an adverse event.

**Question:** I have a patient with 2 target lesions which are lymph nodes and 2 non-target lesions. On her follow-up scan, both lymph nodes decreased below 10mm and are no longer visible. Does this make her a complete response?

**Answer**: by RECIST criteria, if 2 non-lymph nodes disappear and the target lymph nodes are below 10 mm, it would be considered a complete response; however, the size of the target lymph nodes would still need to be recorded. Lymph nodes below 10 mm would be regarded as a normal anatomical lymph nodes. If it is 0.8, it would be considered below the 1cm criteria and thus be regarded as a complete response for the lesion.
